Community Governors are appointed by the Governing Body to represent community interests. They live or work in the community served by the school and have a keen interest in the schools success.

What are Governors?

Governing Bodies are strategic leaders in schools. Governors meet a minimum of twice a term and include parents, staff at the school, local council representatives, and community representatives.

The Head Teacher is accountable to the Governing Body whose role is to set the aims & objectives of the school (together with the Head Teacher) in line with national guidelines and to monitor progress.
