Entry requirements

You'll usually need 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, for a level 3.

Career tips

Many people enter this career after working in the police or the armed forces.

It may be useful if you can speak more than one language for certain jobs, for example diplomatic work.

Restrictions and Requirements

You'll need to:

- have a good level of fitness
- have a first aid certificate
- pass enhanced background checks
- be over 18 years of age
- have a Security Industry Authority licence
- have a full driving licence

Direct Application

You can apply to an organisation directly to work as a bodyguard or go through a recruitment agency specialising in security work. You'll need a Close Protection licence issued by the Security Industry Authority.

To get a licence, you'll usually need to have completed the Level 3 Certificate for Working as a Close Protection Operative. If you've previously done older security qualifications, check whether they are still acceptable. If you need additional training you can find an approved training provider.


