You will need...

- A full driving licence and a licence for the vehicle you'll be driving.
- A good driving record. Your employer might supply you with a delivery van, but if you're self-employed you'll need your own vehicle along with full insurance.

- collect items from a warehouse or pick up
- plan the route and load the vehicle to match this route
- contact customers and update tracking systems and records
- make deliveries, give invoices and get customer signatures
- record mileage and fuel and return undelivered items

- > excellent verbal communication skills
- > to be thorough and pay attention to detail
- > the ability to organise your time and workload

Progression...

With experience, you could become a Bakery Supervisor or Production Manager in a factory, or move into commercial sales. Another option is to specialise, or become a craft baker and set up your own business.

For both of these you will ideally need English and Maths qualifications at GCSE or equivalent.

You will need a Food Hygiene Certificate.

You'll find it useful to have experience working with food, even if you are just pot washing or serving customers.

For both of these you will ideally need English and Maths qualifications at grade 4 but can re-sit at college if needed.

Experience

- You could start with a part time job in a restaurant/ café or kitchen to gain knowledge of the industry and customer service experience.
- You will be able to work independently behind a bar at 18 and can serve alcohol to table in a restaurant at 16 if supervised.
- Working in an events setting such as a theatre or wedding venue is also a great way to gain experience and will enhance any future applications.

Responsibilities

help to load and unload passengers' luggage

take job details over the radio, by phone, on the in-car computer or via an app

Apprenticeship

Some Counties are running a Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship (PCDA). This is a 3 year work-based programme that leads to a degree in Professional Policing Practice.

For both of these routes you will need to qualified to Level 3 standard in either a course, A Levels or BTEC subjects.

Experience

You can volunteer with the Police Cadets up to the age of 18 and progress to become a Special Constable or a PCSO at 18 years. Both of these will look good on your future application to the Police Force.

 - Attend a specialist university and complete a degree in musical theatre, acting or drama.

Entry requirements

- You'll usually need 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, for a Level 3 course, A Levels or BTEC subjects.
- Not all universities require UCAS points it will be based on auditions and individual experience too.

Experience

It is vital that you can demonstrate your talent whether that be youth theatre, local groups, summer camp assistant or recording your own work at home. All experience is massively advantageous and will support your applications for jobs, auditions and university.


