Conservator

University

Conservators come from a range of subject disciplines so the subject you study will depend on the area of conservation you want to work in

Examples of conservation specialisms include:

- fine art
- buildings and heritage
- o archaeology
- o books and paper
- textiles
- human customs and cultures

There are also specialist degree, diploma and postgraduate qualifications in conservation

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 2 to 3 A levels, or equivalent, for a degree; for postgraduate study you will require a degree in a relevant subject

Top Tips

You'll find that internships are a useful way to get practical experience after studying

You'll also have an advantage when looking for courses and jobs if you have some relevant work experience. For example with a museum collection or historic site



You may be able to move into certain kinds of conservation work if you've got relevant qualifications and experience. For example, building conservation may be suitable if you're a qualified stonemason, plasterer or roofer

If you want to specialise in conservation of crafts, like stained glass, decorative stonework or metalwork, you're more likely to build up your skills and experience through a work-based route

Apprenticeship

You can start out by doing a Cultural Heritage Conservation Technician Higher Apprenticeship, then take further training to qualify

You could also apply for a Cultural Heritage Conservator Degree Apprenticeship if you have the right experience and qualifications

Entry requirements

Most people following this route have some GCSEs, usually including English and Maths, or equivalent, for an Intermediate Apprenticeship and 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and Maths, for an Advanced Apprenticeship

Conservation professionals

Conservation professionals are responsible for ensuring that landscapes, habitats and species are protected and enhanced via appropriate management and conservation. They promote public understanding and awareness of the natural environment and help to develop and implement appropriate policies to achieve these objectives.

Common tasks in this job:

- promotes and implements local and national biodiversity action plans, particularly with regard to threatened species and habitats;
- carries out environmental impact assessments and field surveys;
- implements, evaluates and monitors schemes for the management and protection of natural habitats;
- provides advice and information to government at national and local levels, clients, landowners, planners and developers to facilitate the protection of the natural environment:

Plasterers

Plasterers apply plaster and cement mixtures to walls and ceilings, fix fibrous sheets and cast and fix ornamental plasterwork to the interior or exterior of buildings.

Common tasks in this job:

- mixes, or directs the mixing of, plaster to desired consistency;
- applies and smoothes one or more coats of plaster and produces a finished surface, using hand tools or mechanical spray;
- pours liquid plaster into mould to cast ornamental plaster work;
- measures, cuts, installs and secures plaster board and/or ornamental plasterwork to walls and ceilings;
