



Lighting Technician

College

You could complete a college course like: Level 3 Certificate or Diploma in Production Arts Level 3 Certificate in Technical Theatre: Sound, Light & Stage

T Level in Media, Broadcast and Production

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, for a Level 3 course; 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and Maths for a T Level

Apprenticeship

You may be able to start in this job through the following advanced apprenticeships:

Live event rigger
Live venue technician
Creative venue technician
Installation electrician and maintenance electrician

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and Maths, for an advanced apprenticeship

Top Tips

It's a good idea to build up a portfolio of your work. This could be a showreel DVD or online profile of productions you've worked on, which you can show to potential employers.

University

You could do a Foundation Degree, Higher National Diploma or Degree in:

- Performing Arts (production)
- Lighting Design
- Lighting and Performance Technology
- Technical Theatre

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 1 or 2 A Levels, or equivalent, for a Foundation Degree or Higher National Diploma; 2 to 3 A Levels, or equivalent, for a Degree

Work

You could qualify as an electrician first and then get practical experience in production lighting

Volunteering

You will need relevant practical experience. You may be able to find a traineeship with a specialist lighting company. You could also look for experience in the following settings:

lighting equipment hire companies

theatres or concert venues

amateur theatre

student or community film projects

You can search for film and TV companies to approach for experience through media business listing services like PACT and The Knowledge



Career path and progression

You could work on more complex events, or specialise in areas like electrical safety, inspection and testing, pyrotechnics or rigging

Day to Day tasks:

Lighting technicians set up and operate lighting for concerts, conferences and theatre, or film and TV productions

- interpret a lighting designer's plan
- help to rig and check the equipment
- carry out risk assessments for health and safety purposes
- plan where to run cables and place lights at film locations
- ➤ take cues from the stage manager in theatre or the floor manager in TV
- programme and operate manual and computercontrolled lighting systems
- > take down equipment after shows or filming



You could work at a film studio, on a film set, at events, in a theatre or at a TV studio

Your working environment may be hot, outdoors some of the time, at height and you may spend nights away from home

You may need to wear protective clothing

Engineering technicians

Engineering technicians perform a variety of technical support functions to assist engineers with the design, development, operation, installation and maintenance of engineering systems and constructions.

Common tasks in this job:

- plans and prepares work and test schedules based on specifications and drawings;
- sets up equipment, undertakes tests, takes readings, performs calculations and records and interprets data;
- prepares estimates of materials, equipment and labour required for engineering projects;
- diagnoses and detects faults and implements procedures to maintain efficient operation of systems and equipment;

Electricians and electrical fitters

Electricians and electrical fitters assemble parts in the manufacture of electrical and electronic equipment, and install, maintain, and repair electrical plant, machinery, appliances and wiring.

Common tasks in this job:

- examines drawings, specifications and wiring diagrams to determine the method and sequence of operations;
- selects, cuts and lays wires and connects to sockets, plugs or terminals by crimping, soldering, brazing or bolting;
- cuts, bends and installs electrical conduit;
- assembles parts and sub-assemblies using hand tools and by brazing, riveting or welding;
