Apprenticeship

You could apply to do an apprenticeship to get into this role, for example:

- Photographic Assistant Level 3
 Advanced Apprenticeship
- Photographer Level 4 Higher Apprenticeship

These apprenticeships take around 1 year and 6 months to complete, and are a mix of learning in the workplace and off-the-job study.

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 or equivalent, including English and Maths, for an advanced apprenticeship or 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 and A levels, or equivalent, for a higher or degree apprenticeship

Top Tips

You'll need a portfolio of your work to show your skills, interests and experience in photography. It'll also help you to get noticed if you post examples of your work online.

University

You could do a foundation degree, higher national diploma or degree in:

- photography
- visual arts
- commercial photography
- art and design

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 1 or 2 A levels, or equivalent, for a foundation degree or higher national diploma. Or 2 to 3 A levels, or equivalent, for a degree

College

You could take a college course such as:

- Level 2 Certificate in Photography
- A Level Photography
- Level 3 Diploma in Photography These may help you to find a job as a photographer's assistant in a studio.

Entry requirements

You'll usually need 2 or more GCSEs at grades 9 to 3, or equivalent, for a level 2 course or

4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4, or equivalent, including English, Maths and a creative subject
